Reeve Senft has carried out a survey relating to the cost of fire service from various Municipalities. Attached are his findings.

9. New Business

- a. Consideration of approval of the 2017 Operating and Capital Budget. Should Council approval the budget the following resolutions are required.
 - 1. That the 2017 Operating and Capital Budget be approved for the year 2017
 - 2. That the Municipal Mill Rate for the year 2017 be set at 8.84, that being an increase of 5.92% over the 2016 funding requirements to operate the municipality, which is a dollar value of \$56.576.
 - 3. What is the location of the road construction for 2017?
- b. That the Municipality participate in the 2017 Beaver Control Program and that it be open to the residents of the Municipality and the Village of Lipton and Dysart residents.

- c. Approval for the construction of an approach to the NE-15-22-13-W2, as the property was subdivided and the original farm-site supplied the approach to the lands, and now the owner of the site does not wish to have equipment accessing his property. The Municipality policy for access to lands is attached,
- d. Approval from Council is required for the withdrawal of Municipal Hail Insurance from the land owners: Czemeres Enterprises Inc., Czemeres Glenn and Sherry, Walter Grainger, Walter Nakonechny, Rocky View Acres Inc.
- e. Consideration of a proposed subdivision of the NE-35-23-13-W2, Wesley Klisowsky. The proposed subdivision is 40 acres, approximately half of the site is under water and Council may take this into consideration as Section 5.3.2(g) permits the approval of a larger subdivision due to physical circumstances. Should the subdivision be approved, as a condition of the subdivision, the party subdividing the land shall be responsible for the development of an approach off a municipal road to the remaining lands.
- f. That the Administrator be granted approval to attend the Administrator's Conference May 15 to 18 in Saskatoon.
