Council Reports:

Division 1:

Councillor Huber stated that the roads are good condition with the shoulders being trimmed. He is placing gravel on a portion of Township Road 222 as black soil has come to the surface.

Division 2

Councillor Van Luven informed Council that he is going to have the culvert on the southside of Murray Hubers opened. He stated he getting some gravel to place on Range Road 2142 by section 2 as black soil has come to the surface. He suggested that a letter be forwarded to Mr. Behnke to fill the hole adjacent to Township Road 224 NW-23-22-14-W2.

Division 3

Councillor Czemeres stated the Grid roads take priority over the Municipal

roads for Spring grading, and that the Foreman be informed that the South Grid has not been graded for shoulder trimmed to date.

Division 4

Councillor Slywka stated the roads drying off and that the Freeland is being trimmed and graded today and the Strasbourg will be the next road in the rotation.

Division 5:

Councillor Miller stated that there are rocks showing on the Strasbourg and suggested that she will prepare a map and perhaps if other divisions have rock issues that maps be prepared in order that a contractor can be retained to remove them. She stated that the school bus signs on the Strasbourg by Bingham property have been knocked down or removed and need to be replaced.

Division 6:

Councillor Arthur stated that he has signed right of entry agreements, and has one more to complete. He inquired about the dirt piles left on the fields from the tests for clay. Suggested that he retain the contractor that did the test holes to level them off.

Reeve:

Reeve Senft informed Council that he is the process of getting right of entry agreements for the road construction, and was waiting for a response for the Andjelic lands. He and the Administrator met with the Foreman to review his job description and clarified with him that he would be reporting to Council at their regular meetings. He informed Council that he could not attend a meeting with the Reeve of Kellross and a Councillor, however Councillor Arthur and Czemeres met with them to discuss the hiring of a foreman, and what other options that could be explored to work together for the benefit of the taxpayers. It was suggested that a joint meeting of the two Councils meet to explore alternatives and perhaps have a facilitator to assist in mapping out options to be considered. That the Road Committee meet to explore road options for a gravel haul route for W.F. Botkin and then invite the representatives to an on site meeting to determine a route and finalize each parties responsibilities.
